Playground Project

ALRA is in discussion with Stafford Borough Council, and other stakeholders, to establish what can be done to upgrade and improve the Playground areas on Aston Lodge.

Blackies Lane

There are no major developments to report regarding the grassy patch site, that we fought so hard to save from development, but there is an update. In a recent conversation with Stafford Borough Council, they confirmed the following:

- They continue to require a developer to have an agreement in place with a housing association, as part of any new planning application for homes built outside the settlement boundary, that use the C5 Rural Exception Policy.
- This places contractual restrictions on any development, as well as a potentially lower yield for the developer.
- To date, no housing provider has agreed to partner developments on another similar site, which uses C5 to support the application.
- The lower sections of the grassy patch site are now classed as a flood risk area, and so cannot be built upon. This reduces the developable area.
